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SERIES ONE: British Public Record Office Documents, 1720-1832. 69 reels of microfilm.

The British Public Record Office serves as a repository for all national records in Great Britain. Colonial records housed there are scattered throughout several official designations, dependent upon the nature of the record or its office of origination. Georgia's colonial records in this series were discovered within seven such categories of classification, each of which is a subseries, organized chronologically. For a more detailed discussion of colonial records at the British Public Record Office see Charles Andrews' *Guide to Materials for American History to 1783 in the Public Record Office of Great Britain*, vols.
