In this presentation, take a peek inside the Atlanta Fed's Monetary Museum to learn about the Federal Reserve System's structure and functions as the U.S. Central Bank. Images of historical currency, coins and artifacts from antiquity, a solid gold bar, and much more, will be shared as Hennessy takes you on a "virtual tour" of the museum.

The Atlanta Fed provides programs in both economic and personal financial education aimed primarily at educators in the Sixth Federal Reserve District. Hennessy's responsibilities include management of the Sixth District's programs in community relations, economic and financial education, and outreach in addition to serving as curator of the Bank's Monetary Museum.

Before joining the Atlanta Fed, she taught high school economics for twenty-four years in Augusta, Georgia, and served as an AP Economics reader for the College Board. She is a graduate of the Education Policy Fellowship Program's class of 2012-2013. Hennessy was the Georgia Council on Economic Education's 2009 Economics Teacher of the Year and is the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta's 2017 President's Award recipient. She has a BA in History from Augusta College.
