Microfilming Program

- Georgia Archives and Genealogical Society of Utah partnered to microfilm Georgia state and county records, 1950s-1960s
- Genealogical Society of Utah has master negatives of microfilm
- Genealogical Society of Utah is now FamilySearch
- Georgia Archives microfilming program, ended 1996
- Less than 10% of our records are available online



Probate Records

- FamilySearch is scanning its microfilm of Georgia county probate records and adding it to Georgia Probate Records collection.
- FamilySearch does not have all the microfilm online in this collection.
- There are some probate records that Georgia Archives microfilmed and FamilySearch did not.
- There are some original records that have not been microfilmed.

About this collection

The County Records Microfilm Index is the card catalog, compiled by Georgia Archives staff, of the Archives holdings of county records on microfilm. The cards have been scanned and saved in PDF format with one PDF for the cards for each county.

Searching the County Records Microfilm Index: Pick the county from the drop-down menu. This search will retrieve the record for all cards for that county. Each record will have the Title target and County Cards PDF. Click on County Cards PDF to bring up the catalog cards for the county in one pdf file. You can scroll through the cards to find the card for the records you need.

Arrangement: Each county has a card at the beginning of the file, giving the date of the county creation, plus the date of any courthouse disasters which may account for a gap in the records. CAUTION: If the first card contains dates for courthouse disasters, please check for records. Often some records survived courthouse disasters.

In general, the Archives does not have microfilm for county records after 1900. If a record book begins before 1900, the entire book is included on the microfilm (for example, 1898-1936). Occasionally, the Archives has records for a county into the 1930s or 1940s. The Archives does not have records for any of the twenty-four counties created after 1900; there are catalog cards for these counties with their dates of creation.

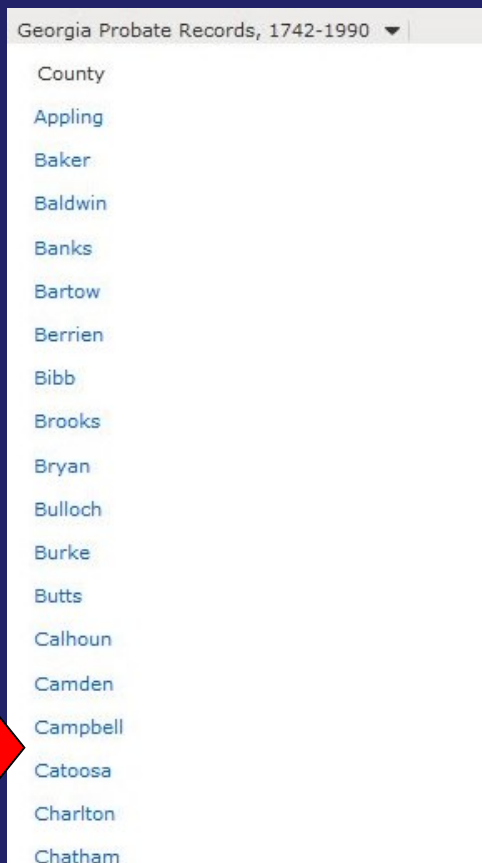

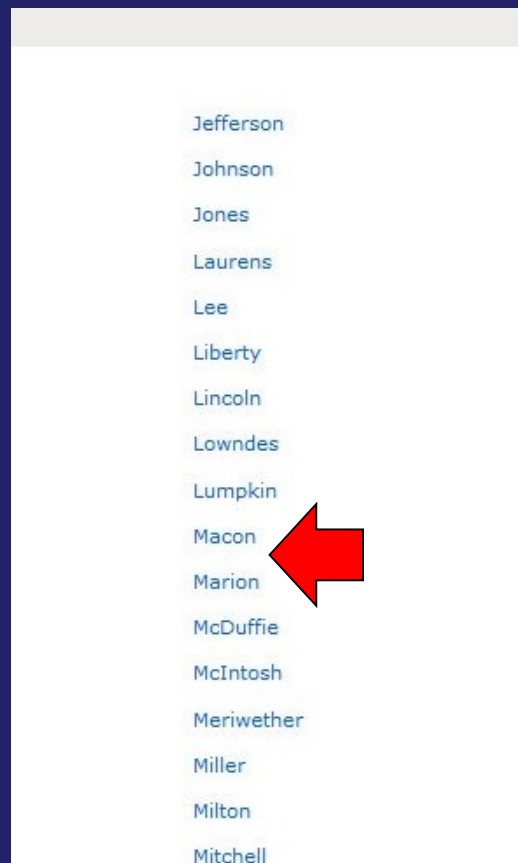

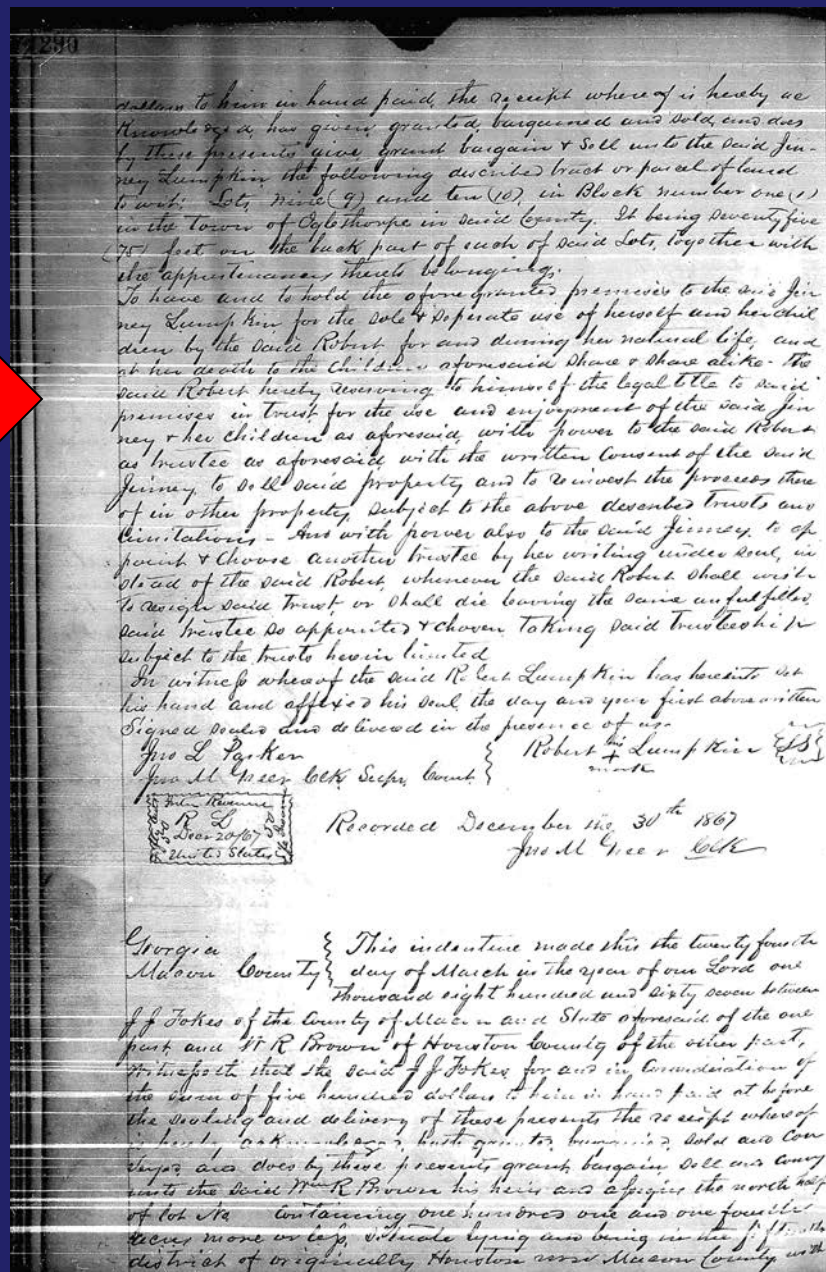

Genealogical Information from Screven County Deed

- John Minsey is the son of Shadrack Minsey, who is deceased, and the grandson of Patience Mizell.
- Patience Mizell was married twice, because her current husband is Luke Mizell, not Minsey.
- Shadrack Minsey is deceased by 1803.
- John Minsey is not yet twenty-one by 1803.
- Patience Mizell's first husband's name was probably Abraham, because the land being deeded from her to John Minsey was conveyed by the original grantee to Abraham Mizell.



Genealogical Information from Screven County Deed

- Patience Mizell also leaves him two slaves, David and Fanny.
- Luke and Patience Mizell maintain the right to live on the land until they die or move; a “life estate.”
- As Patience Mizell is conveying her property to her grandson during her lifetime, it is unlikely that she will leave estate records.

Dr Edmund Fitzgerald sworn by the State.

Thomas Bagby is dead, I dont remember date of death, some time in September last. I was called to see him at 3 or 4 O'clock, he had a wound on his left side. The wound was a superficial one, had been deep before I saw him. He had another wound on his left thigh made by some sharp instrument, ranging upwards, which entered the cavity of the abdomen. The wound was just above the hip. I examined said witness that had got at him in his abdomen, I did not probe the wound before death to learn whether it had entered the cavity. he died, as witness believed, from effect of those wounds, he died in this County.

Cross Examined.

I cannot say positively what parties saw wound caused his death, unless I had made a post mortem Examination, my reason for thinking the wound penetrated the abdomen was, he had the hemorrhage so bad. My professional opinion is that his death was caused by that wound. My opinion is that he died from the injuries he had received, and I think from the effect of the wound in the hip, he had received other injuries. When I first saw him about 3 or 4 O'clock on Monday Evening after the Camp meeting at Bibb Camp ground, the wound in the cavity was very small. He Examined by State. If he deceased had been in a sleeping position the Doctor might have him more readily.

John Howard, sworn by State. When Thomas Bagby, he is dead. he died about 27th or 28th of Sept last in this County. T. Bagby, & others were called on by Capt Bone to patrol at Bibb Camp ground. We soon found Negroes with Spikes and flogged them. Bagby & others & thus were summoned to patrol at the Camp meeting. Bagby went off to look for others, soon I heard a noise, rattling of tin buckets and running. I saw a row by me, I saw by him and caught him. the 2 boys first caught aided witness in holding him. Bagby came along, he having been in pursuit of him. The Prisoner, Bagby said, See you have him John. I then saw by left hand a arm. Bagby took hold of his right. I proposed to walk further off. Went about 100 yards. We then proposed to walk him down. The Prisoner then made an effort to get loose, the boys attempted to get hold of him, one of them said that Prisoner had his knife out. I am not certain that the negroes got hold of him, one of them said that Prisoner had his knife out. Bagby then said he had no knife and to take hold of him. We had a struggle with him. He struck Bagby several blows & witness saw. We then took him.

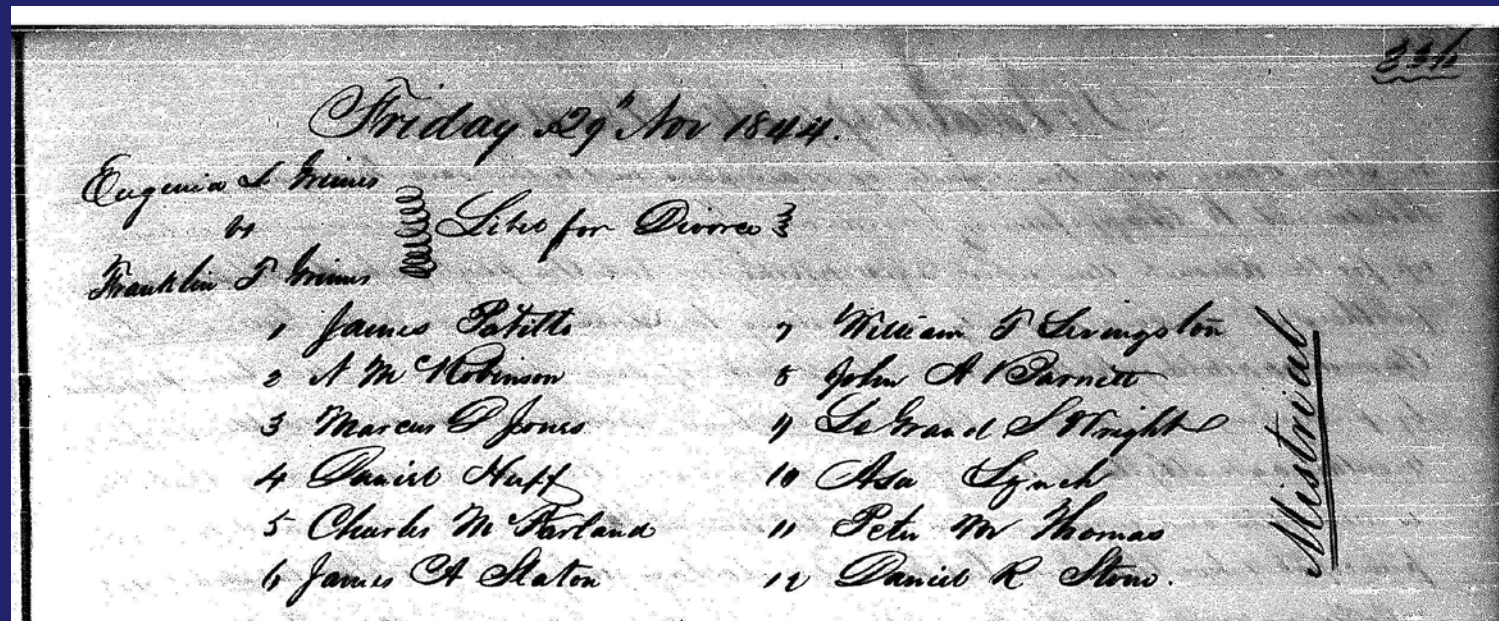

County Court Records

- Created in 1866.
- Replaced Inferior Court functions except those dealing with county governance.
- Dealt with civil cases under \$100 and criminal cases except those punishable by imprisonment in the penitentiary.
- Abolished in 1868 when new state constitution was passed.
- Re-established in 1872 for forty-four counties.
- Often cataloged under Inferior or Ordinary Court Minutes, also Criminal Court.

Supreme Court Records

- Supreme Court established in 1845, first cases heard in 1846
- Supreme Court Reports, published written opinions of the Supreme Court justices to support court's verdict
- Supreme Court Case Files: motions, writs of error, pleas, exhibits, often includes case files from original trial
- Archives has divided into two series, pre-1917 case files ("Ancient") and post-1917 case files
- Case files up to 1860 available on microfilm
- Database for pre-1917 cases available in Reference Library



Supreme Court Cases

- Head v. Head (1846)
 - Wife left husband, returned to father in Alabama
 - Court ruled abandonment was not sufficient grounds for divorce
- Sanders v. Ward (1858)
 - Testator ordered executors to sell land and slaves and take named slaves to Ohio and manumit them.
 - Court ruled it was legal for executors to take slaves out of the state to manumit them
 - Law of 1859 closed this loophole



Supreme Court Cases

- Dillon v. Dillon (1878)
 - Free woman of color sued her white common-law husband for alimony
 - Court ruled she was entitled because the legislature had passed a bill (1857) granting her the rights of a citizen
- Hargraves v. Lott (1881)
 - Young man sued grandfather's executors for cheating him of legacy left in grandfather's will (1856)
 - Court ruled he was a slave at the time will was executed
