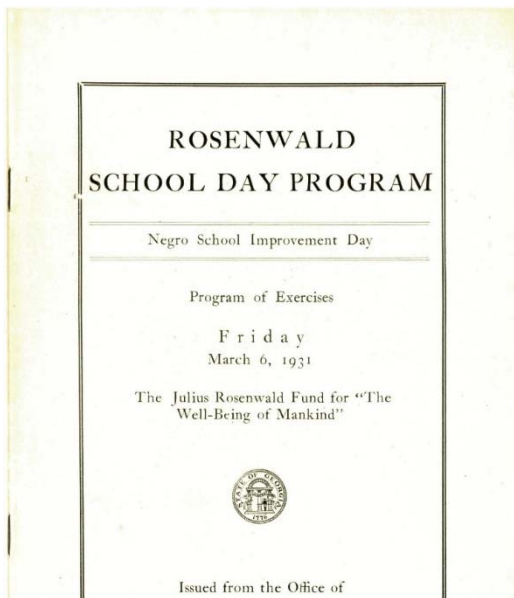


Register Now For Free Onsite Classes

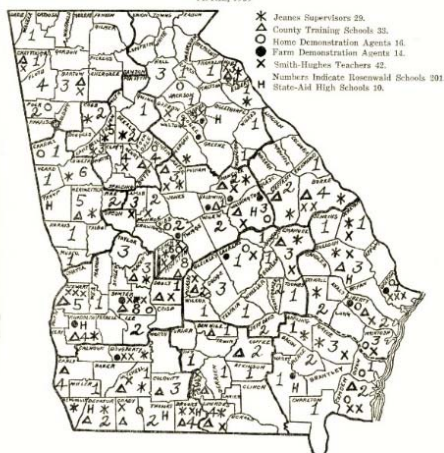
