Georgia Celebrates the United States Constitution

The Georgia Archives will present *Georgia Celebrates the United States Constitution*, an exhibit exploring Georgia's connection to the creation of the U.S. Constitution and the ways the state has commemorated that history over time. The exhibit will be on display from Saturday, April 15, through Saturday, November 14, at the Georgia Archives in Morrow, Georgia.

As the nation continues to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the United States, the exhibit offers another opportunity to consider Georgia's place in the Revolutionary era and the formation of the new nation. Georgia delegates Abraham Baldwin and William Few helped draft and sign the U.S. Constitution in 1787, and Georgia became the fourth state to ratify the document the following year.

Drawing from the collections of the Georgia Archives, the exhibit includes original records and other materials connected to Baldwin and Few, Georgia's ratification of the Constitution, and commemorations of the Constitution throughout the 19th and 20th centuries. Together, the materials show how Georgians have understood and commemorated the Constitution and the state's role in the nation's founding.

Georgia Celebrates the United States Constitution will be available for viewing during the Georgia Archives' regular hours, Tuesday through Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Georgia Archives is located at 5800 Jonesboro Road, Morrow, GA 30260. Admission is free.
