REGISTER FOR FREE CLASSES ON GEORGIA'S RESPONSE TO THE DESEGREGATION OF SCHOOLS

Four free classes that cover education during segregation and the State's response to the desegregation of schools using records at the Georgia Archives are now open for registration. The classes are made available through a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.
