“Hello, My Name is...”
A History of Georgia Politicians with Unusual Names

March 2020 Lunch and Learn

On Friday, March 13, 2020, noon-1:00 p.m., the Georgia Archives’ Lunch and Learn program will be “Hello My Name Is...”: A History of Georgia Politicians with Unusual Names by Junior Historian Andrew Bramlett.

Some Georgian politicians with unusual names in the presentation include Eugenius Aristides Nisbet and Argin Artemas Boggus.

Fourteen-year-old Andrew Bramlett is a local historian living in Kennesaw, Georgia. He is Vice President of the Kennesaw Historical Society and an Honorary Member of the Cemetery Preservation Commission for the City of Kennesaw. He volunteers with the Kennesaw Parks & Recreation Department and also volunteers at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, where he is a tour guide on the shuttle bus to the top on the weekends.

In 2018, Andrew won a Georgia Historical Records Advisory Council Award for Local History Advocacy because of his work on the presentations that he gives about the history of the City of Kennesaw, Kennesaw Mountain, and his Kennesaw City Cemetery Walking Tour.
