Morrow, GA, October 1, 2018 – On Saturday, October 13, 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. to celebrate our centennial and Georgia Archives Month, the Georgia Archives will present a new tour “Georgia Archives, 100 Years: Where We Are Now”: Stories in Pictures: Miniatures, Daguerreotypes, Tintypes and More.

From painted portraits to digital photography, images have captured the history of the times. This unique tour will take you back in time. Learn about the momentous historical events behind photographs of everyday people and places in a tour of Vanishing Georgia photograph displays. Then available just for this tour, view rarely seen miniatures, daguerreotypes, tintypes and more taken from our vaults in our Original Documents Reading Area (ODRA).

Here are just a few of the treasures you will see:

- A painted miniature of William Scarborough (1776-1838) and a piece of actual hair. William Scarborough lived in Savannah and was the owner of a shipping business. He owned S.S. Savannah- the first steamship to cross the Atlantic in 1819.
- Pins with photos of Mr. and Mrs. Joe and Elizabeth Brown. (Joe Brown was the 42nd governor of Georgia and the only governor to serve four-terms 1857-1865).
- A daguerreotype of William Few who represented Georgia at the Constitutional Convention of 1787 and was elected as Georgia’s first United States senator under the new constitution.

The tour is free. No registration is required. Please wear comfortable shoes.
